### Commentary on un-audited 2nd quarter results

Attached are the un-audited financial statements, for the quarter ended November 1, 2008, which have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards.

The Group's turnover for this second quarter is \$6.8billion compared to \$4.3billion last year-a 58% increase. The year-to-date turnover is \$13billion compared to \$7billion last year – an 82% increase. These increases are primarily due to the ethanol operations.

Gross profits for the quarter amounted to \$540million, as against \$533million in the previous year. The year-to-date gross profit is \$1.5billion as against \$1.1billion.

Last year's second quarter report was impacted positively by out of court settlements on a shipment of ethanol in the amount of \$145million, which was reflected in other income.

Distribution costs along with administrative expenses for the quarter increased by 22.5% in line with inflation.

Financing costs, including exchange losses, of \$126million for this quarter compared to \$153million last year shows a decrease of \$27million-18%.

Against this background, losses after tax for the second quarter amounted to \$121million. The after tax net profit for the year- to- date amounts to \$60million.

During this quarter the Group was negatively impacted by two unexpected events:-

- 1) Sale of a contracted shipment of anhydrous ethanol after a significant decline in market prices.
- 2) A hurricane in the US Gulf which delayed our regular shipment of grains. Alternative supplies had to be quickly sourced at a higher cost.

Based on contracted purchases and sales for November and December the ethanol operation is projected to generate good profits in the third quarter.

During the past six months the poultry operations experienced a 22% increase in the unit cost of production caused by significant increases in grain and energy inputs. However, due to a selling price decrease in August and subsequent market constraints, the selling price increases were restricted to approximately 13% over these six months. Increased costs were not fully recovered by selling price increases, which resulted in a \$100million reduction in our year-to-date segment results in the poultry operations, when compared to last year. We are expecting a return to acceptable margins in poultry in the third quarter, subject to a relatively stable exchange rate.

The staff, management and Board will continue to trust in God's guidance as we seek to further enhance shareholder value.

### Notes to the Interim Consolidated Financial Statements

### Accounting Periods

At the start of this financial year the accounting periods were changed.

The company's financial year now consists of 12 accounting months ending on the Saturday closest to the calendar month end. In the previous year(s), consisting of 13 accounting periods, the quarterly Profit & Loss account for each of the first three quarters consisted of 12 weeks and the fourth quarter consisted of 16 weeks.

The accounting year ends on the Saturday closest to April 30.

### Basis of presentation

These consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with and comply with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) and have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets

### Segment reporting

The group is organised into three main business segments

Poultry Operations - Rearing of poultry for fertile egg production, broiler grow-out; broiler processing and sales growout and sale of started pullets.

Feed and Farm Supplies-Manufacturing and sale of feeds and sale of farm supplies

Ethanol Operations- The processing and export sale of fuel grade ethanol

Other operations of the Group include the sale of feed ingredients; cattle rearing, processing and sale of beef products; grow out and sale of fish; and co-generation energy supply.

Ourrent assets include biological assets with a carrying value of \$787.2million at November 1, 2008 (\$663.4million at May 03,2008) Biological assets include poultry breeder flocks, hatching eggs, baby chicks, chicken being grown out, grain fed cattle,. fish and started pullets(layers)

These assets are carried at cost as no reliable measure for determining fair value has been identified
